Keep the Conversation Going

Hey families, here are some activities to do together to help you keep the conversation about Covenant Renewal going at home. We hope they help you have fun, share, and talk about your faith together!

Recap the Story

As a family, read the story about Saul and Ananias. You can find it in the Bible in Acts 9:1-22 (try the CEV or NIrV for a kid-friendly version), or "Saul's Conversion" in a storybook Bible.

You may choose to act the story out with dolls or other figures as the characters, a torch for the heavenly light, a scarf or strip of paper as the road.

Discuss together:

I wonder what is the best part of the story

I wonder what is the most important part in the story

I wonder if there is any part we could take out and still have all the story we need

I wonder where you are in the story or what part of the story is about you

Get Crafty

As a family, pull out a big piece of paper and some art materials eg. felts, coloured paper, magazines, glue, scissors, glitter. Work together to craft a beautiful poster that says, "Today our family is saying YES to God." Then hang it somewhere in your home where you will see it everyday.

Saying Yes

Ananias and Saul both heard God's voice and chose to say yes and do what He said. Their listening to God and doing what He said was all part of God's big plan.

As a family, brainstorm some things that God and/or Jesus told us to do in the Bible (eg. commandments, instructions).

Then add to the brainstorm the specific things God has asked you (through the Bible, a voice, a feeling, other godly people).

Pray Together

If your family signed Covenant
Renewal cards on Sunday, get them
out - you may like to share with one
another why you chose to sign
them. Then swap cards with each
other and pray for the family
member whose card you received.
Pray thanking God for making
them, for putting many wonderful
gifts in them. Ask God to keep
speaking to them, and help them
trust Him and say yes to what He
says.

If your family didn't sign Covenant Renewal cards, instead simply share with one another what God has been talking to you about (through the Bible, a voice, a feeling, other godly people). Then draw each other's names out of a hat and pray for one another.
