THE EXILE AND RETURN



(2 Kings 25, 2 Chronicles 36, Ezra, Nehemiah)

In those days, the city of Jerusalem was surrounded by a tall wall. Inside the city of Jerusalem was the temple. The People of God knew that God was in the temple, but they thought it was the only place you could pray to God. They also thought the city walls would protect them from everything.



Then the city was attacked and destroyed. The King of Babylon's army broke down the walls, burned down the temple and took many of the people away. The People of God looked back at Jerusalem and wondered if they'd ever see if again.

As soldiers marched them through the desert towards Babylon, they had to do EVERYTHING the soldiers said. "Get up! Go there! Eat this! Do that! Go to bed!" It took a long time. They grew weary and some died. They were in exile. They could not go home.

The people dreamed of their home and temple, sang sad songs and even faced towards Jersualem when they prayed.



Slowly they began to realise God was in <u>this</u> place too. God's presence came to them when they gathered to tell the old stories, pray and read scriptures.

Many of people were allowed to work in Babylon. They set up little businesses. Some even worked for the King.



It was a surprise when the King of Persia came with His army and took over Babylon! This new King began to let some of the people go home - some went back to Jerusalem and began to rebuild the temple and the walls.

> And then, the People of God were no longer in exile – they could go home. But do you know what happened? Some decided to stay, because they knew God was there, in the strange and foreign land, too.
