our beliefs

We believe that all people need Jesus and as a church, we have found that faith in Him makes a difference in our everyday lives.

Our church is part of the international Salvation Army, which itself is part of the universal Christian Church. The Salvation Army's message is based on the Bible and we follow mainstream Christian (Protestant) beliefs. The Salvation Army operates in more than 120 countries.

For administrative purposes, The Salvation Army is divided into territories. We are part of the New Zealand, Fiji and Tonga territory. Our territory's mission statement is 'caring for people, transforming lives and reforming society, by God's power.'

Our beliefs are summarised in the following 11 doctrines (please see over page):

Our church's mission is to 'care for people, transform lives and reform society, by God's power'.

simplified doctrines of The Salvation Army*

- 1. God helped good men to speak and write what is in the Bible, so that from it we may learn the way God means us to live.
- **2.** There is only one God, and He is altogether perfect in every way. He is the Creator, Preserver and Governor of all things. We should not worship anyone or anything else.
- **3.** God the Father, Jesus Christ the Son, and the Holy Spirit are one God.
- **4.** Jesus is both truly God and truly human: He has both God's nature and our nature.
- **5.** Our first parents by their disobedience, lost their sense of God's favour, and came under the power of sin; and because of this we are all inclined to do wrong.
- **6.** On the cross Jesus suffered and died for everyone, so that whoever wants to, may be saved.

- **7.** To be saved we must be truly sorry for doing wrong and trust in Jesus; then the Holy Spirit will make us new people.
- **8.** Salvation is a free gift from God. It is received when we believe in Jesus; and when we are saved we know it.
- **9.** To keep good we must trust in Jesus to help us, and we must go on doing what He wants us to do.
- **10**. Saved people are given the chance to be used by God to help Him. When they have given themselves to Him fully, they can be given power to serve Him, and be kept from sinning.
- 11. When our bodies die we ourselves go on living in a new and different way. At the end of time Jesus will be the judge of all people. Those who have chosen Him to be their Saviour will be happy to live with Him as their King forever. Those who have not done so will always be unhappy because they chose what separates them from all that is good and lovely.

Sunday at 10am

We hold church services every Sunday morning at 10am. These services are planned to be relevant, open, fun and welcoming to all people, and are followed by morning tea.

Kids Church

Children aged 2 to Year 8 at school are encouraged to participate in Kids Church (check out the kids page for more details) which runs during the morning service. There is also a crèche space available for parents with children under 2.

Sunday at 6pm

On the first Sunday of each month (except January), we hold an evening service at 6pm. These services include vibrant praise and worship, a challenging message and an opportunity for personal prayer and ministry.

Connect Lunch

If you are new to our church, we'd love you to come along to our quarterly Connect Lunch. You'll get to meet some of our leaders, find out more about our church, plus meet other new people.

Life Groups

Life Groups are a great way to connect with others and build your faith in God. They're usually made up of around 10 people who meet regularly to study the bible and enjoy fellowship together. Check out the noticeboard in the foyer to find the right group for you.

Men's and Women's Events

We host a range of events and groups for men and for women, including a craft group and annual adventure weekends away. Check out the newsletter or our website for details on upcoming events.

Alpha

If you are exploring faith, Alpha is the course for you. Run over seven weeks, it's a practical introduction to Christianity and a great forum to raise all those questions you'd love to ask.

The Marriage Course

The Marriage Course is designed for any couple wishing to build a strong and lasting relationship. Over eight evenings, couples enjoy a candlelit dinner and talk about important issues that can get ignored in the rush of daily life. There is no group discussion and no requirement to disclose anything about your relationship to anyone else. This course runs twice a year.

Parenting Courses

The Parenting Courses are designed to equip those parenting or caring for their children/teenagers with long term strategies to build a healthy family life. We run courses concurrently over five weeks, one for parents/caregivers of primary school children and one for parents/caregivers of youth.





Kids Church

Kids Church is for children aged two years old to year 8 at school and runs during the morning service. We teach the children Biblical truths as a series of monthly virtues, so as well as connecting with God, the children are expected to develop qualities like love, trust, contentment, wisdom and compassion.

The children also undertake a service project and enjoy a social event each term.

mainly music[®] is a very popular music and movement programme for pre-schoolers and their parents/caregivers. We hold two sessions on Tuesday mornings during school terms. There may be a waiting list. See our website for more information.

Social Assistance

Our social support team offers emotional support and advocacy for those who need it. We have an emergency food pantry on site and may be able to assist with furniture and clothing from our Family Store.

Family Store

Funds raised from sales in our Family Store support our other community services, but our store is much more than a means to make money. People in need can be provided with assistance and a number of people have re-entered the workforce through working as volunteers in the stop.

Community Meal

Our community meal is called offered every Wednesday from 6pm - 7pm. It's a low-cost, nutritious meal for the whole family. Just \$2 per person or \$5 per family. You don't need to book – just turn up.

Budgeting Service

Our professional Budgeting Service has qualified independent Christian budgeters available who provide financial advice in a safe, non-judgemental and accepting environment. There is an affordable fee per session. To make an appointment, please phone the church office.
